# Message from Rabbi Jan Katz

I, for one, am excitedly anticipating TBI's Lake Winnipesaukee cruise on Saturday, August 3, and all the wonderful communitybuilding that will assuredly happen at this event, along with a brief *Havdalah* ceremony to end the Sabbath, musical entertainment and singalong by our very own member/musician, John McArthur, and food and beverage to nurture our bodies along with our spirits.

The *Havdalah* cruise implies that *Havdalah* precedes "the cruising." With that in mind, allow me to explore in this Tablet message one of the many teachings on this very brief and beautiful ritual.

*Havdalah* (literally: distinction or separation) marks the end of Shabbat and the beginning of the next work week. The rituals of sipping wine, smelling sweet spices, and creating shadows in the light of a multi-wicked candle are all designed to draw our attention to the vast gulf between Shabbat, the sacred day of rest that is a foretaste of the World to Come, and the rest of the week.

Jewish tradition teaches that drawing distinctions is critical—a key to wisdom—and not just the distinction of Shabbat, but three other distinctions of importance to the Jewish people. This is the final blessing of *Havdalah*, which is not always recited aloud:

Blessed are You, Eternal our God, ruler of the universe, who distinguishes between the sacred and the profane, between light and darkness, between Israel and the other nations of the world, and between the seventh day and the six days of creation.

The four separations in this blessing list are not value-neutral. We know that sacred is preferred to profane. Ditto Shabbat and the six days of work. Light and darkness, too, are not without moral valence. So where does that leave the distinction between Israel and the nations of the world? Are we to understand that Israel is superior to other peoples? Unique among others?

In a Talmudic discussion of *Havdalah*, we find the following argument about this concluding blessing of the ceremony:

Rav said the blessing should conclude with the phrase: Who sanctifies Israel.

And Shmuel said the concluding phrase is: Who distinguishes between sacred and profane.

# Abaye cursed those who concluded the blessing in accordance with that opinion of Rav. (Pesachim 104a)

Shmuel argues that the final blessing point back to the main purpose of *Havdalah*, while Rav's formula echoes the conclusion of the Friday night *Kiddush*: "who sanctifies Shabbat," creating a set of liturgical brackets around Shabbat. Yet, Abaye vociferously condemns Rav, cursing those who close *Havdalah* by thanking God for sanctifying Israel, disgusted with those who would conclude the holiest day of the week with a statement of Jewish superiority.

A different point of view (*davar acher*) by our sages refer to other distinctions in our sacred texts: *between the ritually impure and the ritually pure; between the sea and the dry land; between the upper waters and the lower waters (re: second day of creation); between the priests, Levites, and lsraelites, etc.* 

Can we say which is greater of these items? I think not, meaning that they are equal in value. By virtual of association, the same can be said about Israel and the nations. Thus, *Havdalah* or "distinction" is not a value judgment of two or more entities, but rather a way to isolate, observe and appreciate the uniqueness inherent in every creation. As we sing the blessings of *Havdalah* together, let the taste of sweet wine, the aroma of the spices, and many lights of the *Havdalah* candle remind us yet again that we are all equal in our uniqueness!


