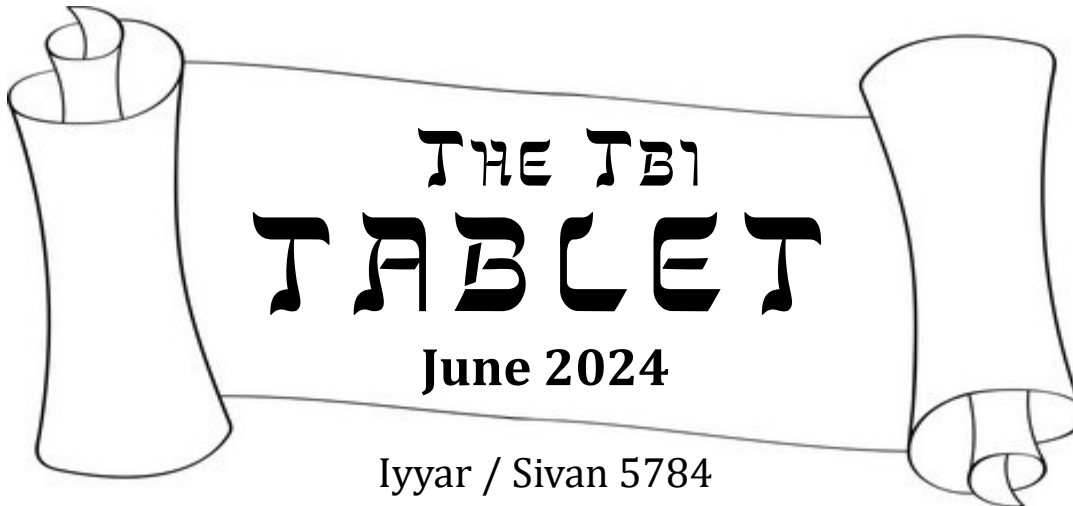

Message from Rabbi Jan Katz

For Ira, an original adaptation of Proverbs 31:

Ish Chayil Mi Yimtzah – A man of valor who can find?

By way of a frame of reference, the Merriam-Webster Dictionary defines valor as “strength of mind or spirit that enables a person to encounter danger with firmness, in other words, “courage.” In the Jewish world, valor or ***ish chayil*** takes on the meanings of “righteousness, determination, compassion, and responsibility.” And, Proverbs 31 is best understood as a poem that uses imagery to elevate regular daily activities into something wonderful and holy. The poem is written as an acrostic, with each line beginning with the next letter of the Hebrew alphabet. When a poem uses all the letters in the alphabet, it's a way of including absolutely everything a person might do, “from A to Z,” as we might say. It refers to a noble person who carries out seemingly mundane actions, like clothing one's family, preparing food, shopping, and trading or investing, with care and love. It can be understood as a hymn to the beauty that lies in performing everyday activities with love and dedication.

Our ***ish chayill***, our “man of valor” rises in the night to provide for his family. He plants a vineyard and tends to his business. He gives to the poor and oversees the workings of his household. He is trustworthy and a source of stability. His family and community praise him.

The Hebrew word for valor, ***chayil***, can also mean soldier. Our ***ish chayil*** is also a warrior, a “fighter” in heart. He fights not only for his personal world and for those he loves, but also for the world around him. Our soldier ***ish chayil*** strives to fight a just battle balancing his own needs and those of others. If taking out the opposition exposes innocents, their integrity and dignity must prevail.

In *Pirkei Avot* 4:13 (“Ethics of Our Ancestors,” a rabbinic text), Rabbi Shimon outlines a system of leadership consisting of three crowns—Torah (rabbinic leadership), the priesthood, and the monarchy—but also notes that a “good name” is the crown that rules all of them, no matter what the title or manner of leadership. For Temple B'nai Israel, the crown of a good name at this time goes to our fearless outgoing President, Ira Keltz!

Ira, you have a good name and a great heart!

Yanking someone's chain as he ***yearns*** to bring them cheer in a battered world!!!
