# Message from Rabbi Jan Katz

This month Israel is set to pay tribute to the casualties of war and terrorism, those who paid the ultimate sacrifice for the sake of the modern State of Israel. Yom Hazikaron - (Memorial Day) will be commemorated on the 4th of the Hebrew month of Iyar, on Monday, May 13. Natan Alterman's famous Hebrew poem, Magash Hakesef ("The Silver Platter") about the human price that we have paid, will be read at every memorial service. The poem's title is based on a quote by Israel's first President, Chaim Weitzman from December, 1947:

A State is not handed to a people on a silver platter.
אין מדינה נתנת לעם על מגש של כסף

The juxtaposition of Yom Hazikaron and Yom Ha'atzmaut (Independence Day) the very next day, implies that without the sacrifice of the heroic generation of 1948, and the succeeding wars, we would not have a Jewish State. In his poem, Alterman describes a war-torn land, a homeland of "smoky frontiers" still burning from battle. He wrote of a Jewish homeland that was "torn at the heart but continues to exist" as we experience both "terror and joy" together. In the poem's final passage, Alterman conjures up the image of two young Jewish soldiers, a boy and a girl, who are battle-weary and fatigued, covered with the dirt and grime of the long, hard war they've been fighting. It becomes clear that these two young Jews are no longer among the living. As they stagger into view, an entire nation gazes on them, also exhausted, and in center stage are the injured soldiers at the front lines defending the first Jewish country in nearly two thousand years. Finally, the two young soldiers say softly: "We are the silver platter on which you were handed the State of Israel." Their job is done, now up to succeeding generations to live out their dream.

The poem prophetically predicts the upcoming wars and their human cost to ensure the survival of the State of Israel. It does not glorify the fallen, but rather mourns the sacrifice that will be made. That said, the soldiers are the "silver," the metal and the mettle that emerges from determination, strength, boldness, bravery, and courage. They glitter and shine from the smoke and darkness. They enact their own miracles. They may fall and die, but their spirit gives birth to those who witness, those who love them and the vision of an Israel of justice, equity, and love for all who reside there, and a source of pride for Jews outside of Israel who stubbornly keep this vision alive.

The painful confluence of sacrifice for the sake of redemption continues 76 years into the establishment of the State of Israel, as manifest and real as in the images of Altermann's 1947 poem.

Singer and songwriter Naomi Shemer z"l offers gratitude to the Eternal in her iconic Al kol eileh – "For all these things: al hadvash v'al ha-oketz – for the honey and for the sting." We are not meant to avoid the honey because of the sting, but rather appreciate the honey despite the sting of nettle.

Let us mourn the wounded, the captive and the fallen on May 13 and let us also bless and celebrate the existence of the State of Israel on May 14, Israel's 76th birthday!




# Saturday, May 4 at 1:00 pm Yom HaShoah Program at the Congregational Church of Laconia



In observance of Yom HaShoah, Holocaust Remembrance Day, Temple B'nai Israel, the Unitarian Universalist Society of Laconia, the Congregational Church of Laconia, and the Laconia Human Rights Committee are proud to present a program to promote the importance of speaking out against injustice. The program will feature a screening of the acclaimed documentary "Defying the Nazis: The Sharps' War," followed by a question-and-answer session led by Dr. Larry Benaguist.

"Defying the Nazis: The Sharps' War," sheds light on the heroic efforts of Unitarian Minister Waitstill Sharp and his wife Martha. The Sharps, from Wellesley, Massachusetts, risked their lives to save countless Jews and refugees fleeing Nazi persecution across Europe. The film, which premiered on PBS in 2016, was produced by legendary filmmaker Ken Burns and Artemis Joukowsky, III, and is based on the book by Joukowsky, grandson of the Sharps.

Following the documentary screening, a question-and-answer session will be led by Larry Benaquist, Ph.D. Dr. Benaquist is an Emeritus Professor of Film Studies at Keene State College, where he founded the film studies program and played a key role in establishing the Holocaust and Genocide Studies major. He also has extensive experience teaching courses related to film and the Holocaust. Dr. Benaquist played a significant role in the production of "Defying the Nazis," contributing his expertise and research. His personal experience and insights will add a unique dimension to the program.
