Security Procedures for High Holiday Observances at TBI

- The back door is restricted to those with a key who may need to enter before the main entrance opens.
- Please do not follow behind others through the back door.

Rabbi Evan Shultz: On week 1, I mourned. On week 2. I cried. On week 5, I waited. On week 7, I hoped. On week 12, I sang. On week 18, I sat down. On week 25. I lamented. On week 28, I prayed. On week 31, I shouted. On week 34, I believed. On week 39, I grieved. On week 41, I screamed. On week 43, I wept. On week 46, I longed. On week 50, I wished.

If truth be told, this High Holyday season I have doubted (but not abandoned) the efficacy of Teshuvah (atonement), Trust, and Truth. By Teshuvah, I mean the traditional Jewish process by which we are guided to reflect on our individual misguided acts, seek forgiveness, forgive others, and vow to improve in the year ahead. It seems to me that this process does not belong to me or to you alone at this moment in time, but needs to penetrate a quorum of the whole planet, especially those operating at present without a moral compass. By Trust, I mean engaging with, and relying on the wisdom and good will of those around and close to us, those who govern our daily life --providers of food and medical care, and the media, for example- and those who wield the power and decision-making in society. All these, in part, have fallen flat in their unwavering commitment to human potential, human dignity and a united vision. By Truth, I mean what is fact from fiction and from artificial intelligence, and what are uncorrupted guiding principles for living a life of meaning and morality. Indeed, Rabbi Evan Shultz, famously of the above poem written in the month of Elul 2024, has posed to his readers that the story of creation in the Torah has not advanced beyond verse 2 of Genesis: In the beginning God created the heavens

and the earth, and the earth was void, unformed, and full of chaos, and darkness was on the face of the deep. In other words, the order of creation has not yet been realized, with "order" understood as creation of all things and all creatures interconnected and aligned with justice and mercy, according to our rabbinic sages.

How can we take Teshuvah, Trust, and Truth this year to a more relevant place for all of us? Perhaps the only Truth and starting place for Teshuvah lies in our "feelings." We are holding big feelings inside of us that are challenging our values and our views. What we are see around us-on TV, on the internet, and through the eyes of those with whom we have both brief and deeper conversations-are settling in our guts as anxiety, fear, turmoil, and vulnerability. Words may fail us, but feelings are real and affirm that the coming Days of Awe may be just the balm that we need. On those days we act out our feelings in high drama-think of the blowing of the shofar as a noisy, but strong, awesome, and holy phone connection to God, to one another, to our Israeli kin, to all who are suffering near and far; the Ashamnu prayer, the litany of our sins when we beat our chests: and the three repeated and highly atmospheric renderings of the Kol Nidre prayer, the annulment of our unfulfilled vows. We worship together as a way of belonging to a community of mutual respect and shared values, connecting to each other, leaning on each other, and sharing our burdens as well as our joys.

Even as we pray fervently for an end to the unresolved plight of our people in Israel and around the world, and all those oppressed and dehumanized innocents, let us enter these Day of Awe with the intention of finding respite from the weightiness of own feelings and the dampening of our spirits. Please join me on the second day of Rosh Hashanah following our abbreviated service as we immerse ourselves in Israeli and American poems and music written since October 7, 2023—words that capture the very essence of our own big feelings. Together, we will surely find comfort and clarity. *Kein yihiye ratzon* – May It Be So!




