

Hebrew Terms for Passover (and a couple others)
With English Translations

פֶּסַח

Pesach: Passover, also the Passover sacrifice)

מַצָּה

Matza (in the Haggadah also called “Bread of Poverty”)

סֵדֶר

Sei-der (also spelled Seder): order; also the name of the Passover-eve holiday meal)

הַגְּדָה

Haggadah: the book of the Passover narrative used during the Seder meal

יְצִיאַת מִצְרַיִם

Yetzi-at Mitzra-yim: The Exodus from Egypt

מָרֹר

Maror: bitter herbs (horseradish)

כַּרְפָּס

Karpas: greens, fruit of the earth, one of the items on the Seder plate

חֲרוֹסֶת

Charoset: sweet relish representing the mortar used by the Hebrew slaves

מָה נִשְׁתַּנָּה

Mah Nishtana: literally—what has changed, what is the difference

לַיְלָה

Laila: night

לַיְלָה טוֹב

Laila tov: good night

בּוֹקֵר טוֹב

Boker tov: good morning

יוֹם טוֹב

Yom tov: good day (also, holiday, often pronounced “yontoff)

חַג שְׂמֵיחַ

Chag samei'ach: happy holiday!

אֶחָד

Echad: one

אֱלֹהֵינוּ

Eloheinu: our God

דַּיְנוּ

Da-yeinu: Enough! We would be fine already!
