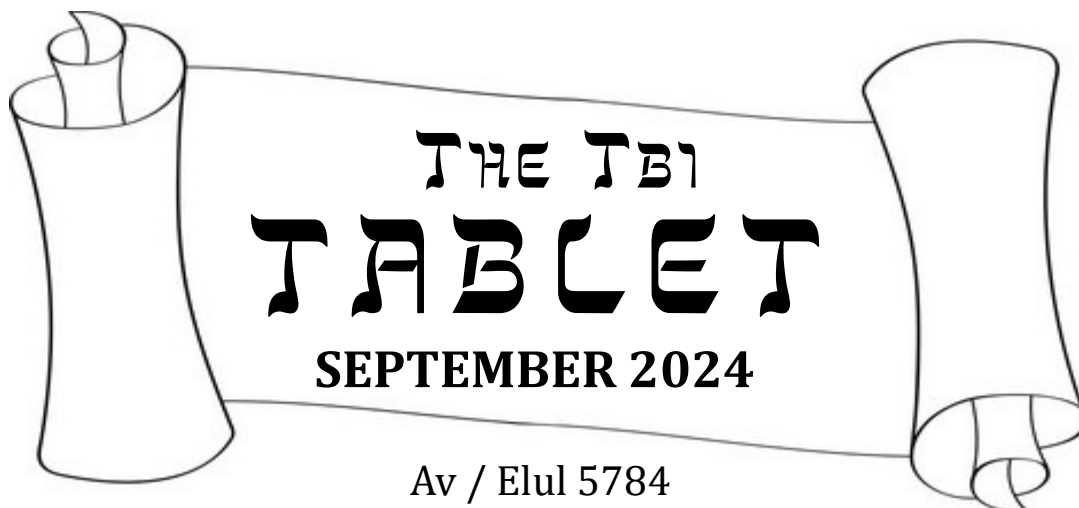

Message from Rabbi Jan Katz

Here we are again—you know “the seasons they go round and round. . . . we’re captive on a carousel of time. . . .”

But this year time and space have halted in their tracks, replaced by a different reality, a different truth. The late Israeli poet laureate, Yehuda Amichai, writes in a short fiction collection from 1984, “The war did not touch them. They were like ducks oiled against the water. Since they did not struggle against fate or war, the war passed over them and did not damage them. They were like an empty house with windows open, the wind passing right through them.” This may be the most appropriate image for each of us as we American Jews, communally and individually face the High Holidays in front of us.

We are most assuredly intellectually and emotionally attuned to the Hamas War and its devastating consequences to our Israeli kin and all the innocents caught in the crossfires. We mourn the deaths and displacements. We are working incessantly from afar and on the ground to sustain the Israel we love through our philanthropy and volunteerism. We comb the news minute by minute to be in the know, in order to defend that love, based on Israel’s founding vision of democracy and peace.

And yet, and yet, are we any closer to closure, to a resolution, to restoration of hostages and true democracy, to healing for Israel and to living side by side with those who are not like us? Even with our efforts, it seems the winds of fate are passing through us without our ability to deflect the destruction in their wake. It is even more so for every Jew and Jewish ally living at this moment in the State of Israel. And, according to Amichai, if we are in a place safe from personal injury, we are even more apt to pass through this crisis, empty of something – empathy, morality, purpose – we don’t know – Amichai does not tell us.

So, this leads us to the quintessential theme of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur—*Teshuvah*, Repentance. How can we invoke *teshuvah*, the presence of God, and our attribute of compassion during the darkest times of our lives? Let’s imagine that *Teshuvah*, with the meanings of “reconciliation” and “returning” for the sake of redemption can offer us a way forward even when none seems apparent, I invite you to join me in an act of faith these *yamim nora'im* — Days of Awe.

Our tradition sets aside Elul, the entire month prior to Rosh Hashanah, for personal introspection and reflections that guide us in our *teshuvah* efforts. It is customary to read daily Psalm 27. The psalm speaks of danger from the enemy and of God’s

protection, of blame, rejection, and acceptance, of fear and of hope. The Rabbis mandated blowing the shofar every day, to remind Jews of the necessity of active repentance and reconciliation with their family and community. Also, on the seven Sabbaths before Rosh Hashanah, Jews read portions of the Prophets that focus on consoling the Hebrew people in their exile

No more shall your sun go down,
Or your moon disappear;
...And your days of mourning shall be ended.
Your people shall be righteous, all of them
And possess the land forever.

Isaiah 60:20-21

These pre-High Holiday practices may not translate into *tikkun olam* – “repairing of the world,” at this moment. This is truly a blow to the spirit and essence of Reform Judaism and its emphasis on our work for social justice everywhere. Let us pivot, rather, to *tikkun atzmi*—“repair of the self.” This is doable. We may not be ready to forgive our enemies but we can forgive ourselves, especially our uncomfortable thoughts and actions and our gnawing uncertainties in a chaotic and often acrimonious environment. We may not be able to effect a change in the uncivil and unconscionable behaviors of others, but we can elevate our awareness of our own needs and those of others in our presence, those whom we truly care about. We may not want to face the sufferings of those we love and cherish, because sadly we don’t know how to help them, but we can take care of ourselves because we matter to them, especially to our families. Finally, just as the *Shechina*, the sheltering Presence of God, refuses to leave us, albeit unable to transform the bitter reality overnight as we would pray for, let us be present for each other, through our words and deeds, by our hugs, or in our silence. This is powerful *Teshuvah*!

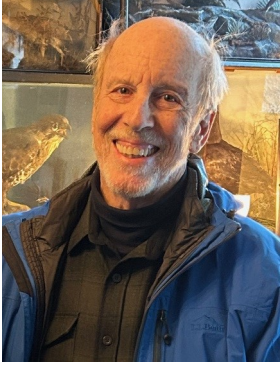

When Judy and I moved to New Hampshire 12 years ago I began looking for a temple at which we might find friends, a comfortable Jewish home, and to observe Judaism. Temple B'nai Israel was an instantaneous fit and as my (and our) roles in TBI have grown so has our feeling of a safe and welcoming community. Unfortunately, what was a low undercurrent of concern about antisemitism became a harsh reality after October 7, 2023. When I assumed the unfortunately necessary role of security chair, I quickly became aware of the breadth of responsibilities. Luckily TBI had the work of our then President Ira Keltz to build upon. I will not innumerate the details of our present and planned physical protection for obvious security reasons. On the other hand, the presence of uniformed police officer and police cruiser at our events is evident to all. When the need for additional security was made known last fall our incredibly generous congregation stepped up and donated several tens of thousands of dollars to fund the immediate needs. We expect to be able to complete our physical enhancement within the coming year. With grants and other resources we will continue our visible security protection for the future. We intend to do this while maintaining TBI as a welcoming and comfortable Jewish home for all.

FUNDRAISING

We have completed all of our TBI fundraising efforts for 2024. The Food Festival and the Digital Directory have contributed about \$25,000 to the operating fund of the temple. So thanks to everyone who supported those efforts throughout 2024.

We do have one more **We Care concert** on October 26th. This concert is for the benefit of the **Circle Program** located in Plymouth. The Circle Program is a nonprofit that empowers and provides opportunities to disadvantaged girls through summer camp and mentorship. We will close out the 2024 We Care season with a high energy vocal band from Branson, MO, **The Cat's Pajamas**. They have won national acclaim successfully performing on a variety talent shows on NBC and other networks in addition to more than 200 shows a year in Branson. We are already working on 2025. Shortly there will be a Food Festival follow-up meeting to discuss improvements that can be made. 2024 was very successful, but we know we have to continue to improve our recipes, cooking, and delivery systems in order to attain the level of excellence we have been able to deliver over these last several years. We also have identified our entertainment and non-profit partners for 2025. We believe we have a blockbuster line-up of talent as well as a mix of new and familiar nonprofit partners. More on those plans as we get closer to 2025.

None of this happens without your support and the leadership of the fundraising team- Barbara Katz, Karen and Joe Lukeman, Sue Needleman, Ken Goodman, and the rest of the dedicated TBI fundraising team. Hope to see you all on October 26th to close out 2024 with a bang and third sell-out in a row.



SECURITY

The Security Committee continues to work to provide the needed enhancements for our safety. We have been able to provide a police presence for our Shabbat services and plan to have each of the High Holiday events similarly protected. Members of your board of directors have stepped up to volunteer to coordinate each of our services' security needs and will be present at High Holiday services. Members and registered guests will be greeted and welcomed at each service.

To date the cost of providing this protection has been funded by extremely generous donations from congregant members. Going forward we hope to defray the continuing cost with monies from a grant from the US Department of Homeland Security. That grant application also included monies for additional security cameras, window and door protection and other building enhancements. We expect to hear the results of our application in October.

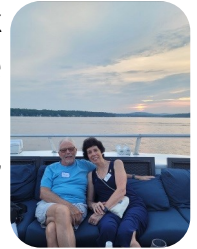
Community *Havdalah* on Lake Winnepesaukee



On Saturday, August 3rd, Temple B'nai Israel (TBI) and the Jewish Federation of New Hampshire (JFNH) joined together for the Jewish community to celebrate the end of Shabbat in true Lakes Region style while cruising on Lake Winnepesaukee. TBI's Rabbi Jan Katz and

Cantorial Soloist Melody Funk led the recitation of the *Havdalah* ceremony with close to 60 people on board the Winnepesaukee Spirit who came to celebrate this sacred Jewish ritual amidst the natural beauty of the big lake.

Mother nature provided a perfect summer evening with a beautiful pink sunset behind scattered clouds. The lake was calm as the Winnepesaukee Spirit cruised from the shore of Weirs Beach around islands, inlets, and coves. The warm breeze wafted the scents of the *Havdalah* spices, *besamim*, throughout the air bringing an awareness of the unique and special experience to all.



Rabbi Jan Katz shared her insights into the significance of the ceremony, "*Havdalah* (literally: distinction or separation) marks the end of Shabbat and the beginning of the next work week. The rituals of sipping wine, smelling sweet spices, and creating shadows in the light of a multi-wicked candle are all designed to draw our attention to the vast gulf between Shabbat, the sacred day of rest that is a foretaste of the World to Come, and the rest of the week. *Havdalah* is a way to isolate, observe and appreciate the uniqueness inherent in every creation. The taste of sweet wine, the aroma of the spices, and many lights of the *Havdalah* candle remind us yet again that we are all equal in our uniqueness."



To accommodate the vessel's safety regulations, the customary three-wick *Havdalah* candle was creatively replaced with three battery-operated tapers. To experience the fragrant element of *Havdalah*, Rabbi Katz prepared individual bags with an orange and whole cloves for each attendee.



The evening was enhanced by the melodic tunes of the 60s and 70s performed by TBI member John McArthur along with food and beverage to nurture both body and spirit.

Temple B'nai Israel gratefully acknowledges the financial support of the JFNH which made it possible to expand enrollment to the entire New Hampshire Jewish community.

Treblinka: History and Evolution of a Killing Center Zoom Webinar

Treblinka was a site that encompassed a forced-labor camp (Treblinka I) and, later, a killing center (Treblinka II) in German-occupied Poland during the Holocaust. By the time that the Treblinka killing center was dismantled in 1943, an estimated 925,000 Jews--as well as an unknown number of Poles, Roma, Soviet POWs--had been murdered there. This presentation will set the stage for 2024 Holocaust Memorial Lecture on 9/24 by discussing some basics about Treblinka. After a short presentation about the history of the site, how it compared to other camps that were run by the SS, and the uprising that took place there, there will be time for questions from the audience.

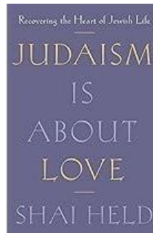


